Payment: A non-refundable deposit of \$25.00 must accompany the registration. The balance must be paid by Monday, June 7th. **Students must pay deposits and balances at the home school. All fees must be paid by Thursday, June 10th, or students will be dropped from rolls.** There will be no exceptions.

Registration: Registration for all students is May 3 – June 10 **at the home school.** Late registration fee is \$25.00. **All registrations will take place at the student's home school only.**

Eligible Students: All Summer School courses are designed for those students who are **REPEATING** a course for **CREDIT RECOVERY**. You **must** enroll in the course you failed, not an alternate course. An exception may be made for a student who would be eligible to graduate from summer school. Only Lexington 5 students will be allowed to attend our summer school.

Grading: Summer school will follow the guidelines for Credit Recovery Level 2. Upon successful completion of all of the assigned modules at 70 percent mastery, the student will receive a grade of 70.

Homework: Due to the rigorous nature of Apex courses, working from home is **mandatory** to complete the course by the end of summer school. To work on Apex from home, you will need a computer, internet access, and your log-on information. If you do not have the required technology, you will need to work additional sessions as they become available. Although curriculum may be completed from home, all assessments will be completed during the scheduled summer school session.

Attendance: Since summer school is a self-paced (computer based) program, attendance will be required from the first day, June 14 until the student fulfills all of the requirements of the course. All absences will need to be excused absences according to district policy.

Scholarships: A limited number of scholarships will be made available for students attending summer school. Contact your School Principal or Summer School Director for more information.
